All Range and Safety rules apply.

Range Rules – As amended on June 5, 2003

- A. Always point the muzzle in a safe direction.
- B. Keep your action open and firearm unloaded until ready to use. On a firing range this means the shooters are in position on the firing line and the range has been cleared for live firing.
- C. Know how the firearm operates.
- D. Be sure the firearm and ammunition are compatible.
- E. Carry only one gauge/caliber of ammunition when shooting. When at a shooting range with more than one firearm, use one at a time and when complete, secure that firearm and its ammunition before using the next one.
- F. Be sure of the target and what is beyond. When on shooting ranges, be mindful also of adjacent areas and act accordingly to insure safety.
- G. Wear ear and eye protection while on the range.**
- H. Do not mix alcohol or drugs with shooting activities.
- I. Be aware that certain circumstances may require additional rules to insure safety

Specific Pin Shoot Rules

1. All persons will follow commands of the ranger officers.
2. No one will handle a firearm unless instructed to do so by the range officer.
3. Anyone NOT shooting will stand back of firing line.
4. If your gun needs to be worked on, you are to take it away from the area, UNLOADED with chamber open and work on it with all safety rules in mind.
5. Shooters will have 9 seconds to shoot as many pins down as they can.
6. 22's have 5 seconds to shoot as many pins down as they can.
7. Pins must be off the table to count.
8. There is a 10 round magazine limit.
9. All shooters must register with score keeper.
10. Non club member will sign appropriate waiver.

How we run our shoots

1. We have 6 tables, there will be six shooters at a time rotating from table 1 – 6, for six relays.
2. 5 pins will be set in a 2 over 3 pyramid configuration.
3. We have 3 range officers and a score/time keeper.
They will control the movement of firearms and pin setting.
4. Each person will set pins when finished at command of range officer.
5. The range officer will call the first six shooters to the line. Each shooter will approach the line with action open, safety on and muzzle pointed In a safe direction.'
6. Range officer will ask if all range officers and timer/score keeper ready.
7. All shooters will make ready at the command of the range officers.
Make ready means load firearm, safety on (revolvers Hammer down)
Hold the firearm at 45°.
8. Range officer will ask Shooters ready? At that point, the start horn will blow and timer starts for 9 seconds.
9. At end of 9 seconds, finish horn blows, there should never be any shots fired after the horn.
10. Any pins shot before or after horn, will be deducted from score.
11. Ranger officer will instruct shooters to unload and make firearm safe. Then lay them on table. Range officer will visually inspect each firearm.
12. Ranger officers will then call out the number of pins each shooter has down. Starting with table one.
13. Range officer will then say "Set pins", at that time the shooters will leave the firing line and set the pins.
14. When pins are set and all shooters are back to the firing line, the range officer will announce change of shooters. All shooters and next six shooters will then and only then, move their firearms. Again with safety on, action open and muzzle pointed in safe direction.

22's Only

15. For the 22 shoot, all the same rules apply, except that the time will be reduced to 5 seconds and pin configuration is 5 pins in a row on back edge of the table.

Tie Breakers

16. Any tie breakers will result in a shoot off. This will be at a 2 second reduction of time, 7 seconds for pistol & revolver, 3 seconds for 22. Shooters will be eliminated, if necessary, until 3 shooters remain. The order of table clearing will determine placement.

Remember: Safety is #1.

Cost and Prizes

The cost is

\$7.00 per gun for center fire.

\$5.00 per gun for 22.

We are running our shoots for the enjoyment of all and to better your shooting skills. If you choose to be in the "money pool" you can.

Money pool will be \$2.00 for those whom choose too. The money will be divided into first, second, and third place. Basically 50% to 1st place 30% to 2nd and 20 % to 3rd. Prize money is only given to those whom participate in putting in the extra \$2.00 to do so.
